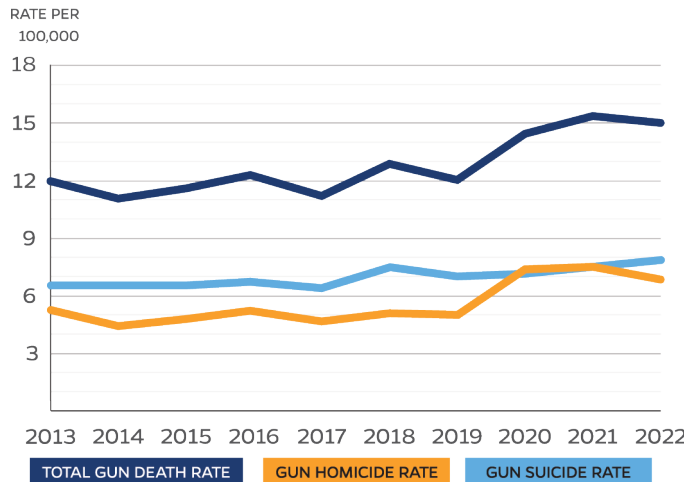
Key Takeaways

- The overall gun death rate increased 25% from 2013 to 2022.
- Young Black males ages 15-34 make up 2% of the state's population but accounted for 38% of all gun homicide deaths in 2022.
- In 2021, there were at least 96 domestic violence-related homicides in Michigan. 66% were by firearm.¹
- Firearms were the leading cause of death among children and teens ages 1-17 in 2022.

Firearms are used in the majority of homicides and suicides



Trends Over Time



Gun violence costs Michiganders \$16.2 billion per year. **This amounts to \$1,616 per person.**²



From 2013 to 2022, the gun homicide rate **increased by 31%**, and the gun suicide rate **increased by 22%**.
