
- The overall gun death rate increased 26% from 2013 to 2022.
- Black people are at the highest risk for gun homicide. They were 23 times as likely to die by gun homicide than their white counterparts. Young Black males ages 15-34 make up 1.2% of the state's population but accounted for 37% of all gun homicide deaths in 2022.
- · In 2021, there were at least 45 domestic violence-related homicides in Minnesota. 56% were by firearm.1
- Firearms were the fourth leading cause of death among children and teens ages 1-17 in 2022.
