
- The overall gun death rate increased 31% from 2013 to 2022.
- Oregon had the 5th highest gun death rate among Black people in the country in 2022.
- Black people were 18 times as likely to die by gun homicide than white people.
- · Firearms were the fifth leading cause of death among children and teens ages 1-17.
- In 2021, there were at least 42 domestic violence-related homicides in Oregon. 48% were by firearm.¹

Firearms are used in the majority of homicides and suicides





Gun violence costs Oregonians \$6.4 billion per year. **This amounts to \$1,518 per person**.²





Gun homicides increased slightly in 2022 from 2021. From 2013 to 2022, the gun homicide rate doubled.
