
- The overall gun death rate increased by almost 50% over the last decade.

- · In 2021, there were 115 domestic violence-related homicides in Virginia. 64% were by firearm.¹

Trends Over Time





Gun violence costs Virginians more than \$14.3 billion per year. This amounts to \$1,645 per person.2



The firearm homicide rate more than doubled over the past decade (increase of 137%).
