
- The overall gun death rate increased 3% in 2022 compared to 2021. From 2013 to 2022, the gun death rate increased 57%.
- · Connecticut had the 6th lowest gun death rate in the country in 2022.
- Young Black males ages 15-34 make up 2% of the state's population but accounted for 29% of all gun homicide deaths in 2022.
- · Firearms were the fifth leading cause of death among children and teens ages 1-17 from 2018 to 2022.
- In 2021, there were at least 43 domestic violence-related homicides in Connecticut. 42% were by firearm.<sup>1</sup>

## **Trends Over Time**





Gun violence costs Connecticuters \$2.7 billion per year. **This amounts to \$752 per person**.<sup>2</sup>



The gun suicide rate increased 17% in 2022 from the previous year and **increased 42%** compared to 2013 respectively.
