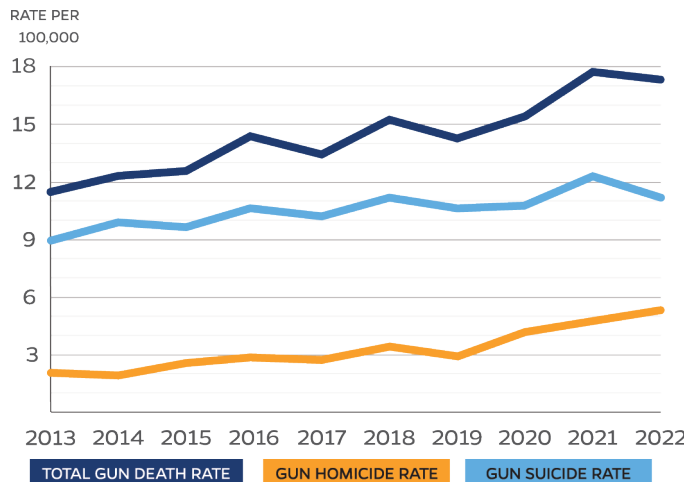
Key Takeaways

- The overall gun death rate increased by 48% over the last decade.
- Young Black males ages 15-34 were 20 times as likely to die by gun homicide than their white counterparts.
- Colorado had the 18th highest gun death rate in the country in 2022.
- Firearms were the leading cause of death among children and teens ages 1-17 in 2022.
- In 2021, there were at least 79 domestic violence-related homicides in Colorado. 63% were by firearm.¹

Firearms are used in the majority of homicides and suicides



Trends Over Time



Gun violence costs Coloradans \$11.4 billion per year. **This amounts to \$1,952 per person.**²



The gun homicide rate increased 10% in 2022 from the previous year and **almost tripled** compared to 2013 respectively.
