- The overall gun death rate increased 76% from 2013 to 2022.
- · New Mexico had the 3rd highest overall gun death rate in the country; the state also had the highest gun death rate among Hispanic/Latino people in the country in 2022.
- · Although Hispanic/Latino males ages 15-34 made up 15% of the state's population in 2022, they accounted for 36% of all gun homicide deaths.
- · Firearms were the leading cause of death among children and teens ages 1-17 from 2018 to 2022.
- · In 2021, there were at least 36 domestic violence-related homicides in New Mexico. 56% were by firearm.1
